We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. (With emphasis) **AMEN**.

And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,

THE PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS

THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

Stripping the Altar (removing all ornaments, linens, and paraments) is an ancient custom of the Church symbolizing Jesus' purposeful, redemptive suffering and death for us. This representation of the humiliation of Jesus and the consequences of our sin prepares us for the celebration of new life and hope of Easter.

THE TRIDUUM

The Easter Triduum invites us to re-live the passion, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. Maundy Thursday to the Easter Vigil are the three holiest days of the year. The services on these days are considered one continuous service spread over three days.

MAUNDY THURSDAY March 28

6p Seder Meals in Homes — Our Lord instituted his Holy Eucharist as the fulfillment of the Passover. Share a Seder meal with family and friends. A copy of the easy-to-follow instructions (Haggadah) are available at the Connect Desk and on our website. The liturgy of this shared meal demonstrates the remarkable ways Jesus fulfilled salvation history in his death and resurrection.

GOOD FRIDAY March 29

7p Liturgy for Good Friday —We ponder the "Goodness" of this Friday with music, scripture, prayers, and the chance to come face-to-face with the hard truth that the Cross was necessary for our redemption.

HOLY SATURDAY March 30

- 7p The Great Vigil of Easter with Baptism The New Fire is kindled, the Paschal Candle is lit, and we walk through the history of God's salvation; Lent ends and Easter begins! Bring something to jingle, bang, whistle, or drum for The Great Noise.
- 9p Break the Fast Party Lent has ended and our Easter Feast begins! Everyone brings a favorite treat to share. Don't miss it!

EASTER DAY March 31

- 10a Festal Eucharist Hail Thee, Festival Day! We celebrate the most joyous occasion of the Christian year: God raising his Son from the dead to conquer death for us.
- 12m Easter Egg Hunt Directly after the service, tots up to 5th grade will gather eggs filled with sweet treats, so bring your Easter baskets!
